## Overview of Antenatal & Newborn screening programmes

Antenatal / new-born Programme timeline	Acronym	Conditions screened for
Fetal anomaly screening	FASP	Down's syndrome, Edward's syndrome, Patau's syndrome & 11 other physical conditions (at 20 week scan). <u>Overview</u>
Infectious diseases in pregnancy screening	IDPS	HIV, Hepatitis B & Syphilis. Overview
Newborn and infant physical examination screening	NIPE	Congenital heart disease; developmental dysplasia of the hip; congenital cataracts & cryptorchidism (undescended testes) <u>Overview</u>
NHS newborn blood spot screening	NBS	Nine rare but serious conditions Overview
Newborn hearing screening	NHSP	Moderate, severe and profound deafness and hearing impairment Overview
Sickle cell and thalassaemia	SCT	Sickle Cell Disease screening for pregnant women in high prevalence areas (or if likelihood of carrier status identified on family origin questionnaire (FOQ). Thalassaemia screening offered to all pregnant women. All biological fathers are offered screening if the pregnant woman is a genetic carrier for sickle cell disease or thalassaemia. <u>Overview</u>
